Brothers and sisters in Christ,

Life can change so fast! One moment your home, property, and life are intact and the next swept away or left in a tangled mess by a tornado or some other unforeseen disaster! We all have seen the pictures or even with our own eyes the devastation caused in Rolling Fork, Silver City, Amory, and beyond by a powerful tornado that made its way through Mississippi.

It is always exciting to see God's people, filled and led by God's Spirit, immediately begin to ask, "what can I/we do to help." On the next day church members made their way to Rolling Fork to provide hot meals off the grill for anyone in need. Others made plans to go on Sunday afternoon and called out for needed supplies. Others got an 18-wheeler and parked it in Walmart parking lot. The word spread throughout the county – bring whatever supplies you can and let's fill this truck up in the Name of Jesus Christ! So many of you responded to these pleas!

Many immediately went shopping and bought supplies. My family's first response was to ask, "what do we already have that we can give?" An image that will remain in my mind is how my daughter responded. She joined her mom in searching through cabinets for food we could give. I remember one particular thing Bethany came across. It was something she really wanted to eat. Her conclusion, "They need it more than I do." She put the item into the bag. Enough said.

It is a beautiful sight to see God's people being who they are already created to be in Christ Jesus! God's love, compassion, joy, generosity, and grace were leading their hearts to do whatever they could do to help. It was also a wondrous sight to see God's people lay their lives down at the altar in prayer for those whose lives had been changed in so many ways! What an amazing difference God's people make in a world that is filled with so much hurt and uncertainty!

There is a greater disaster than tornados, earthquakes, fires, etc. can bring that impacts all of humanity. It is called sin. When that disaster occurred in the Garden of Eden it impacted every person to ever be born – we are born as sinners, separated, from a God Who loves us. By His grace, most reading this article are born-again into His Kingdom, now His child forever, because you have repented of your sins and called upon Jesus Christ alone as your Savior! For you, my brother, my sister, the disaster has passed. You are safe in God's arms. You have been filled with His Spirit. You have been set free from enslavement to sin! No matter how bad the disaster is – God can cleanse this person with His blood, do "clean up" as only He can do, fill this person with His Spirit, causing this person to be His child forever, and turn mourning and hopelessness into dancing, joy, and hope! Now that is what I call Disaster Relief! Or perhaps better said, Disaster Redemption!

This is God's calling for each of our lives and for us together as a church body! Perhaps it would be great to have a team ready to go and help people when physical disaster strikes. It would be even greater too for all of us to be a team who intentionally every week are entering into the lives of those around us who are currently living in the most horrific disaster of all – their sins. I encourage you to ask God what He would have you do to be a part of His Disaster Redemption team!

Also, don't forget - on April 30th, Sunday evening, at 5:00 p.m., we are hoping to have an amazing time of fellowship with one another. It is our prayer that this will be a **WILD** night for all of us. That is a night in which we all become even more determined to **Walk In Love** and **Devotion** with God and with one another! There will be great food for all! There will be great conversation as we share a meal together. There will be reflection on what fellowship is. There will be a call to be and do all we can to walk and live in deeper love and fellowship with God and with one another!

Let's reach out to those who may not normally be a part of our weekly gatherings. Let's reach out to a friend or neighbor or family member who is not in church, or who may not even know the LORD Jesus Christ as Savior. Ask God to lead you to at least one such person whom you can invite or bring with you to this fellowship. Pray for that person. Ask that person. Who knows, this may be just what was needed to bring this person back into fellowship with the LORD and with brothers and sisters in Christ!
