## Wonderful Church Family,

"Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, and before you were born I consecrated you; I appointed you a prophet to the nations ... Then the LORD put out his hand and touched my mouth. And the LORD said to me, "Behold, I have put my words in your mouth (Jeremiah 1:5, 9)." The LORD came to me about 33 years ago and I too heard God calling me into ministry. Once I knew for certain it was the LORD calling – I responded, "yes, LORD, I will follow You in whatever You call me to do!" Over the coming years, God honed that call to being a Preacher/Pastor. What an awesome responsibility! Like Jeremiah, I wondered what do I say? How do I know I am hearing from the LORD? I am so fragile and imperfect. I take great courage from the LORD's words to Jeremiah – "Do not be afraid ... I have put My words in your mouth."

I take my role as "preacher" very seriously. Every week I pray – "LORD, what do You want to say to the people of FBC Yazoo? You know their hearts. Fill my heart with Your words." When I preach, I do believe the words that are being spoken through this very weak, imperfect vessel are God's words to each of us.

How do I come to that place in my mind and heart? I spend hours digging deep into God's word, praying over the passage, listening as best I can to the Holy Spirit, and writing what I believe are God's words to God's people. I ask God's Spirit to prepare my mind and heart through the week, and for Jesus Christ to preach His words in and through me. I speak until I hear Him say, "that is enough." At the same time, I am mindful of and seek to remain in the time allotted to communicate that message.

I have had the opportunity to preach in a number of places in this world – at times with an interpreter. Length of the message or the length of the service was never an issue in these places. I have been in many services that have lasted 2 to 3 hours! For some reason, length is an issue in the United States, but not in all places or local churches. For some it is sermon length. For others the issue is service length. At some point in the history of the local church in the United States the numbers 12:00 noon on Sundays have been given great significance. For some to go beyond those numbers is .... well ... not good.

I heard of a man in one church who would hold up his arm, the one with the watch on it, to let the preacher know, "from this point forward you are in violation of your allotted time." My response to such an action, "I am glad God doesn't hold a stopwatch on me."

When I listen to someone else preach I want to hear everything God has prepared in that man's heart to communicate to me. I go to worship with my heart wide open to be filled with truth – regardless of how long the preacher preaches or the service lasts, and then to respond as the Holy Spirit leads. To me, whatever time it took was time well invested. That time was not too much to give to the Savior Who has saved my wretched soul.

That brings us to present day. God has called me to be your Pastor. God has called me to proclaim and live out His truth to you. I understand for some the length of the message is too long and for some the services are too long. My love for each of you is growing. I intend to be your pastor for long time. The question becomes, what are we going to do?

Over the past few weeks your staff has prayed and thought through what can be done to maintain meaningful worship opportunities while also seeking to keep within the allotted time frame for Sunday morning worship. Here are steps we are taking.

- I will do my best to balance what I believe God desires to say while being mindful of the time in which the service is to usually conclude.
- Your staff will continue to work closely together in providing opportunities for meaningful times of worship through psalms, hymns, spiritual songs, prayer, and worship through the preaching of and response to God's Word - while being mindful of the time allotted for the service.
- A slight change in the service time will also be helpful. We will begin at 10:50 a.m. instead of 11:00 a.m.
- This should enable the services to usually conclude by the appointed time.
- When people are moved to pray at the altar, trust in Jesus Christ as Savior, or become a part of this wonderful fellowship, this may take us beyond the allotted time. May we rejoice that God is working and people are responding!
- I understand the new beginning time encroaches into Sunday School's allotted time. Sunday School actually begins at 9:40 a.m. but most classes do not get started then. The men of the Anchored in Christ class will need to arrive earlier and Tiki and I will need to get started with the teaching a few minutes earlier. If all classes make this adjustment it should allow the choir members to gather when needed and for all to be in the sanctuary by 10:50.

Both the radio and TV ministries are being informed of the change.

Thanks for hearing my heart. Please pray each week for God to fill my heart and my mouth with His words. When you come on Sunday ask God, "Speak to me through Your Servant and help me to respond!" Get ready. When God's people have that kind of hunger for God and His word - great things are going to happen!




