

Church Family,

I want to bring to your attention a couple of opportunities that may really help you grow deeper in your walk with God. For years during my "Morning appointments with my Father," most often referred to as a Quiet Time, in addition to Bible reading, I have dug deep into God's word using a number of different discipleship resources. There are many great resources that are true to God's word, Christ-centered, and God-honoring. Each of these in-depth studies can be life changing. Any time a child of God exposes his/her heart to God's word and really wants to hear from God – God will speak. If you and I will submit to His voice, to His truth, and obey, then God will continue to transform our lives to be more according to His truth and to the character of our Savior, Jesus Christ.

One of those studies in which God moved deeply in my life is called, "Seeking Him, Experiencing the Joy of Personal Revival," by Nancy DeMoss Wolgemuth and Tim Grissom. This particular study caused me to examine "me" in the light of Scripture like never before. During each ½ hour or so study God caused me to examine closely - what has to happen in my life for personal revival to occur, what it means to approach God in humility, just how holy is God and what does it mean for me to be holy, how to have a clear conscience before God and others, what must happen in my life to live by the power of the Holy Spirit, and a number of other spiritual areas of my life.

I considered teaching this as a small group study. Instead, I think God just wants me to make this study available to you. I believe some of you are really hungering to know God in a deeper way and you really do want God's will to be lived out in your life each day. This study will help you get to that place in your walk with God. Be prepared for deep soul searching. Be prepared for a deeper understanding of Who God is and what He has accomplished for you on the cross. Be prepared – God's Spirit will lead you to take steps to walk with Jesus in purity of heart and mind as well as to walk in forgiveness, peace, and love with others.

On September 5, 2021 you will find several copies of this study guide available to you. There is no charge to you for the books (unless you just want to offer to pay). Please feel free to take one and get ready to

begin a lifelong journey of personal revival.

This is also the time of year we get Small Groups going again on Sunday nights. I will be leading a group beginning on September 12, 2021 at 5:00 p.m. The plan is to meet in the sanctuary. This will give us the space we need (across the front pews) to spread out and alleviate any Covid concerns.

We are going to study a book that has just recently been published. The name of the study is, "We Will Not Be Silenced," by Erwin Lutzer. In the foreword, David Jeremiah, pastor of Shadow Mountain Community Church, writes these words, "If I could, I would put "We Will Not Be Silenced" into the hands of every Christian in America ... This book examines every cultural issue we are facing. Nothing is left out. It addresses diversity issues, racial issues, gender issues, social justice issues, media issues, issues of free speech, and issues rooted in socialism and Marxism. Most importantly, it covers issues related to the church and how it is responding to all of this."

In Erwin Lutzer's words, "I want to inspire us to have the courage to walk toward the fire and not run away from the flames. God has brought us to this cultural moment, and our future cannot be taken for granted. As has been said, 'In a time of universal deception, telling the truth is a revolutionary act.'"

In order to have educated, productive, and fruitful discussion each person will need to read the required chapter before meeting together. If you are interested in this study, the Book/workbook sets should be available by September 5. Some will be available in the sanctuary foyer or church office. The cost of the Book/workbook will be \$20. Yes, a couple can share. There will be a sign-up sheet for the study wherever you choose to pick up your books. Please pay in the church office or you may put \$20 or a check in an envelope marked, "Bible Study," and place it in the Tithes and Offerings box. I look forward to a great time of learning and discussion with each of you!

5 Reasons to Join the Choir

Musicality—singing in a choir improves the way you hear music. Where choral singing is concerned, the whole really is the sum of its parts, and choir members soon become aware of how harmonies combine and complement each other.

Mental Health—Studies have shown that the mental health benefits of choral singing include enhanced brain function, strengthened feelings of togetherness, and the release of endorphins and oxytocin resulting in reduced stress and depression.

Confidence—It's surprising how many people are told at school they can't sing. The truth is that, unless there is hearing loss, anyone can learn to sing. Singing in a choir gives you permission to make noise as part of a group, and choir leaders report witnessing new members' confidence grow rapidly.

Belonging—Social media networks offers a semblance of community but the lack of contact with people in real time and space can intensify feelings of alienation. Being part of a group working towards a shared endeavor, can fulfil this human need for belonging and union.

Overall Health—A proper singing session is a wonderful workout for the lungs. All this lung action reduces the chance of illness and is excellent for people who suffer asthma, and emphysema.

First Baptist offers a number of opportunities for Biblical Studies geared on specific age levels, each grade school class providing opportunities for a child to give their life to Christ. This is why it is so very important for you to take advantage of each opportunity. Pollster George Barna put it this way: The current Barna study indicates that nearly half of all Americans who accept Jesus Christ as their Savior do so before reaching the age of 13 (43%), and that two out of three born again Christians (64%) made that commitment to Christ before their 18th birthday. One out of eight born again people (13%) made their profession of faith while 18 to 21 years old. Less than one out of every four born again Christians (23%) embraced Christ after their twenty-first birthday. Staggering and frightening. Then he added something interesting... Among Christians who embraced Christ before their teen years, half were led to Christ by their parents, with another one in five led by some other friend or relative. Comparatively few accepted Jesus in response to a minister's personal prompting (7%) and only one out of eight cited a special event as the turning point in their journey. Among those who mentioned events, about half identified a church service. Just 1% mentioned media evangelism or other special situations as being responsible for their conversion. You, mom and dad, have a great responsibility for your children's eternal destination. The church programs are designed to help you. Let us help!

Would you consider donating these items for 1 bag? How about 2 or more complete bags. You may drop your items by the church office during the week, or the fellowship hall on Sunday. The children are working on personal cards right now for each bag to hopefully encourage the children who so desperately need it. Thank You!




